In 1979, **LEVEL II, Inc.**, installed its Message Switch as the heart of ACCESS, Washington State Patrol's statewide law enforcement communications network. The company has provided sharply performing and supremely reliable public safety systems ever since.

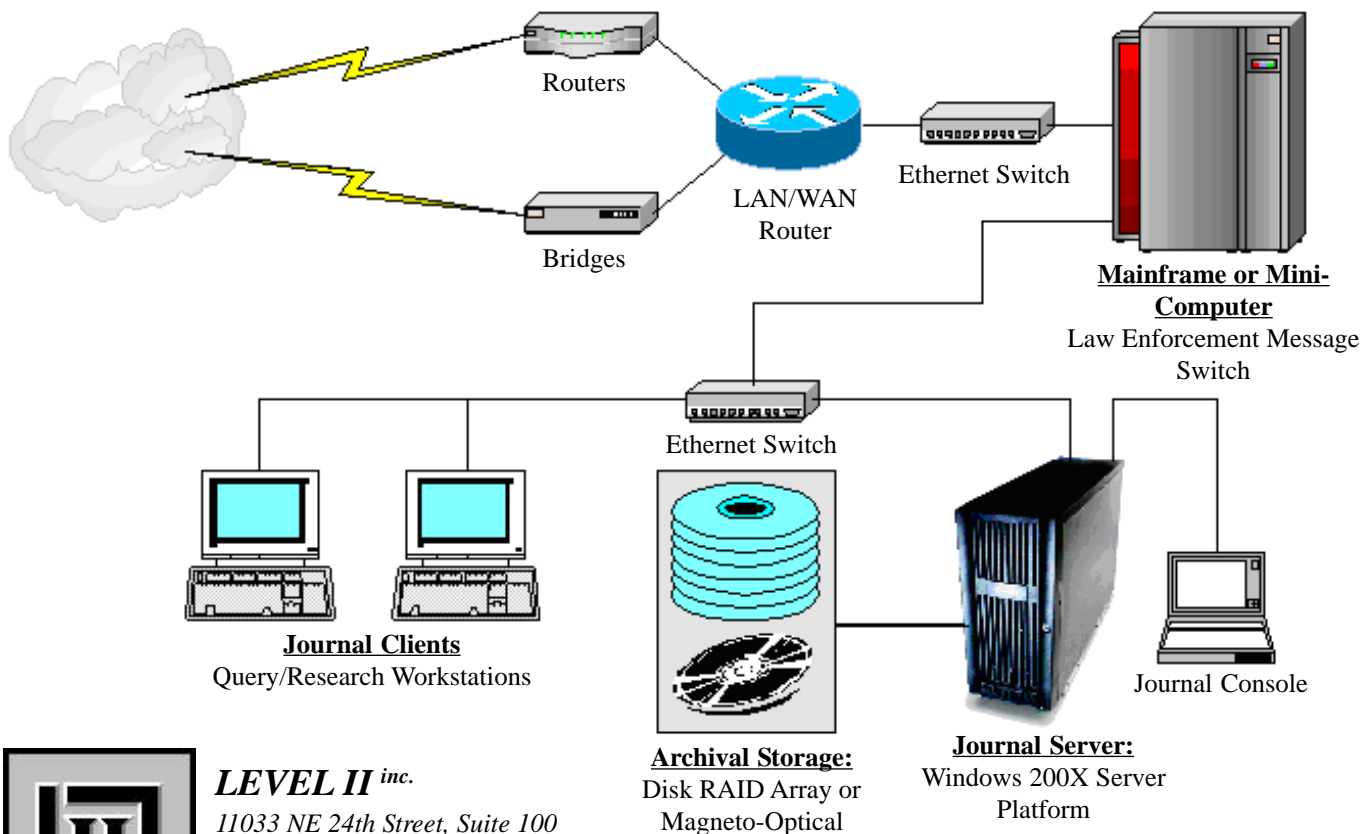
Today we emphasize two products whose designs embrace current open technical standards. These products are (1) **The JOURNAL**, an intelligent archive, and (2) **MAGUS**, the fifth generation descendant of our original ACCESS Message Switch.

The JOURNAL automatically archives transactions flowing through your local or wide area networks. The archive's media are either RAID facilities or magneto-optical (MO) disks. MO disks safely retain data for over a century. The product

accommodates rapid searches of large archives (terabytes), retrieving all records that contain sought character strings. Despite startling search speeds, the system needs no programming that defines records' format or contents. General law enforcement archives must function thus, for law enforcement networks often carry hundreds of different record types. Records' formats change almost continually. New record types emerge and old types fall into disuse. We created **The JOURNAL** to meet these needs, and more, at trivial cost.

This diagram depicts but one of many ways to configure **The JOURNAL** to automatically capture archival data. It is the preferred way and, often, the most economic.
